Students will follow a scope and sequence of courses that provide an opportunity to earn a high school diploma within the typical four years or less, as well as, the option to pursue an Associate's of Arts in General Studies within the four (4) year time frame. The actual sequence of courses students follow varies according to the student's interests and intended career pathway. Students begin taking core subject area classes at first, but then have the choice to pursue an AA degree.
